Christian encouraged graduate programs to inform students & faculty that Graduate Continuous Enrollment (GCE) forms need to be submitted to HSU College of eLearning & Extended Education (CEEE), SBS 211 by 5p.m. on Friday, September 2, 2016 to avoid a \$25 late fee. Completed forms received on or after September 6, 2016 will be assessed the late fee (Monday, September 5 is a campus holiday.) Applicants with extensive work experience, exceptionally high GPA, or exceptionally high GPA and GRE scores may be accepted without meeting the minimum requirements for both GPA and GRE scores by appeal of the department faculty to the Graduate Advisory Council, through the Graduate Coordinator."
