As of now there are no plans to have a separate commencement ceremony for graduate students.
4	Per Nikola Hobbel's request, discussion of the Comprehensive Examination	Discuss and clarify policy and Title 5 requirements for culminating experiences for the Master's degree at HSU.	Nikola Hobbel asked for pros and cons from other HSU graduate programs offering the Comprehensive Examination as a culminating experience requirement. Important reminders: To be compliant with Title 5 regulations, a record of Comprehensive Examination questions and responses shall be maintained.
			According to HSU policy, the Comprehensive Examination should be equivalent in rigor to the thesis and project and must be evaluated by at least two faculty members.
5	Educational Leave Agreement requests	Discussion of possible causes and alternatives; clarification of the need to stay in touch with students on leave.	Graduate Studies has seen a significant increase in the number of Educational Leave Agreements - 2012-20, 2013-24 and so far in 2014– 39. Discussion of possible causes and the need for faculty to stay in touch with students on leave. Eric Van Duzer requested data in order to compare the number of Educational Leave requests after the Graduate Continuous Enrollment Policy was implemented. Christian Guillien offered to research the date the policy was approved by Academic

			Senate. Discussion to be continued at a future Graduate Council meeting.
6	Improving thesis/project submission process	Discussion on best practices to ensure the integrity of the thesis/project submission process and accuracy of the thesis submission form.	Discussion – Jená shared details of the Automated Thesis/Project Submission and Approval Process project request she submitted to IT. An automated approval process would encompass the submission and request from the student, to the Advisor/Committee approval, to final review of Graduate Studies and be placed in the Humboldt Digital Scholar. The process would ensure the integrity of the thesis/project submission process and the accuracy of the final product. GC also suggested that the Application to Advancement to Candidacy and Graduation also have an automated approval process. Jená recommended that advisors turn theses into turnitin.com. in order to reduce potential plagiarism and check students' work for improper citation by comparing it to the database.
